

NOTICE OF MEETING TO VOTE ON TAX RATE

A tax rate of \$0.10000 per \$100 valuation has been proposed by the governing body of Emergency Services District #1.

PROPOSED TAX RATE	\$0.10000 per \$100
NO-NEW-REVENUE TAX RATE	\$0.10940 per \$100
VOTER-APPROVAL TAX RATE	\$0.11395 per \$100

The no-new-revenue tax rate is the tax rate for the 2026 tax year that will raise the same amount of property tax revenue for Emergency Services District #1 from the same properties in both the 2025 tax year and the 2026 tax year.

The voter-approval rate is the highest tax rate that Emergency Services District #1 may adopt without holding an election to seek voter approval of the rate.

The proposed tax rate is not greater than the no-new-revenue tax rate. This means that Emergency Services District #1 is not proposing to increase property taxes for the 2026 tax year.

A PUBLIC MEETING TO VOTE ON THE PROPOSED TAX RATE WILL BE HELD ON September 17, 2026 AT 5:00 PM AT Marlin Volunteer Fire Department.

The proposed tax rate is also not greater than the voter-approval tax rate. As a result, Emergency Services District #1 is not required to hold an election to seek voter approval of the rate. However, you may express your support for or opposition to the proposed tax rate by contacting the members of the of Emergency Services District #1 at their offices or by attending the public meeting mentioned above.

YOUR TAXES OWED UNDER ANY OF THE RATES MENTIONED ABOVE CAN BE CALCULATED AS FOLLOWS:

$$\text{Property tax amount} = (\text{tax rate}) \times (\text{taxable value of your property}) / 100$$

The 86th Texas Legislature modified the manner in which the voter-approval tax rate is calculated to limit the rate of growth of property taxes in the state.

The following table compares the taxes imposed on the average residence homestead by Emergency Services District #1 last year to the taxes proposed to be imposed on the average residence homestead by Emergency Services District #1 this year.
